From menu to firm quote

This catalog is Royal Markets' **sourcing menu** — the range of Alaska, Pacific, and Atlantic seafood we can broker, with a product code for each line. It is a menu of *options* to qualify demand, not a live inventory list. Use it like this:

- 1 Browse by category.** Salmon, whitefish & groundfish, halibut & flatfish, crab, shrimp & prawns, scallops, and specialty. Each line shows forms, typical sizes, season, kosher status, and an indicative price band.
- 2 Select by code on the order form** (back of this catalog). List the items, sizes, monthly volume, and a target landed price.
- 3 Return the form.** Royal Markets takes the spec to our sourcing side to work live offers and return firm landed quotes — the point at which a purchase order becomes concrete.

Kosher key: **Yes** — finfish with fins & scales **Verify** — confirm with certifying authority **No** — shellfish (not kosher)

For the Israel program — read the kosher column first

Only fish with fins and scales are kosher, so the entire crab, shrimp, and scallop range is **not kosher** and cannot serve a kosher Israel program — that program is finfish only. A few finfish (e.g. sablefish) carry a rabbinic scale-removability question and are marked **Verify**. Certified-kosher product also needs supervision at processing; the buyers' certifying authority has final say.

Forms: H&G = headed & gutted · PBO = pin-bone-out · IQF = individually quick frozen · FAS = frozen-at-sea · P&D = peeled & deveined. Sizes given as weight bands (fish) or count-per-pound (shellfish; lower count = larger).

Wild Alaska salmon

Five wild species, peak-season frozen packs. Sockeye leads on recognition; pink and chum are the volume/value plays; king is the luxury tier. All kosher-eligible.

2025 was a strong rebound year (Alaska forecast ~215M fish), so wild salmon availability is good into 2026 with a firm-but-reasonable price floor. Farmed Atlantic salmon (RM-207) is the choice for a flat, year-round monthly program.

Whitefish & groundfish

The volume backbone. Pollock and Pacific cod are the price-driven workhorses; sablefish is the high-value premium. Farmed Atlantic salmon included here for year-round program planning.

Pollock is the single largest food-fish resource on earth — the easiest line to supply consistently at container scale. Alaska is ~69% of the global sablefish supply, a genuine premium/specialty item.

Halibut

Premium flatfish. Pacific halibut is exceptionally tight in 2026; Atlantic/Greenland halibut is the lower-cost substitute.

The 2026 Pacific halibut quota (~29.3M lb) is the lowest in the fishery's 100+ year history — scarcity and premium pricing all year. For flatfish at volume/value, RM-302 or Pacific cod (RM-202) is the smarter spec.

Alaskan king crab is a luxury line and volatile; snow crab volumes and prices swing year to year with quota. All crab is non-kosher — Mexico market only for a kosher-split program.

Shrimp, prawns & scallops

Wild Alaskan prawns are a delicate premium; warm-water farmed shrimp is the global volume line (note: Mexico produces its own — see the market report). Weathervane is the wild Alaska scallop; sea scallops are the Atlantic premium. All non-kosher.
